

SS 112 Black Studies Two Course Learning Objectives

CLO 1: Analyze the myths and achievements of Black Americans from the time of Reconstruction to the present.

CLO 2: Explain the social and economic exploitation of one group by another, and how it has influenced the body of knowledge about Black Americans in American history and culture.

CLO 3: Discuss common myths and the portrayal of the Black male and the effects of social advancements in the community and industry.

CLO 4: Discuss the common myths and portrayal of the Black female in her role as revolutionary, mother and leader.

CLO 5: Analyze the impact of societal expectations on the mental and physical health of both the Black male and female.

PREREQUISITE or COREQUISITE
